Think about change like surgery. It's never fun, it's usually inconvenient, recovery is a difficult and sometimes journey, and usually, you are forced into depending upon others for help. But in almost all cases, if you had not had the surgery, your life would have been threatened or severely affected negatively. You see, surgery isn't preferable, but it's necessary for life, growth, and health. The same is true with change.


# Registration in Process for Main Street Preschool!

many of whom have returned again. Further, these guests have been young families or younger single people. Our children's ministry has been averaging around 7 children each week, and Hillary now has 10 volunteers on rotation. However, she needs more! We must work to provide a safe, worthwhile environment where kids can learn about Jesus, and their parents can be equipped and feel comfortable leaving them for an hour each week.

We were able to hire an Interim Worship Leader, Jared Duncan, who has been doing an excellent job leading us, and will continue to change and grow our worship ministry in good ways. He will begin working with the choir and musicians in the weeks to come, and is leading us with a healthy balance of both new and old songs we all love. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." By the way, I am preaching to myself in this as well!

Right now, there are two other projects I am working on implementing in our church with the help of so many of you: **small groups and** Mainstreet Preschool.

groups are not intended to replace Sunday school, but are another option for discipleship. There are benefits to both types, and I believe we need both.

We have an incredible opportunity to see Mainstreet Preschool grow into a healthy and vibrant Christian school in our community, which I believe is greatly needed. We are working to hire a new director who can take us there, help hire and train more staff to educate our children well, strengthen curriculum, and boost enrollment.

I'll wrap this difficult topic up with a plea for your prayers for our church. Here are some specific ways you can be praying for the FBC Tucker family in the weeks to come:

- Pray for our children's ministry, Mainstreet Kids. Pray for Hillary as she leads. Pray for more volunteers (knowing you could be the answer to your own prayers). Pray for the transition we will make to another space in the building for more room and better security. Pray for the children who attend, that they would learn to love Jesus and be saved at an early age!
- Pray for our **worship ministry** and **Jared** as he leads it. Pray for his wisdom and discernment. Pray that our church would be joyfully diverse in its music, that we might be just as diverse in its membership.
- Pray for Mainstreet Preschool. Pray for the new director, the new staff, and for enrollment in the next semester.
