



The summer months are upon us and many of you are planning much-needed vacations because—let's be honest—after 2020, we could all use a vacation and none of us got to take one in lockdown last summer. What is your favorite vacation memory? I wonder if you've ever been on a cruise? Lana and I had the joy of taking one for our honeymoon over 10 years ago. It was a 10 day trip, and every morning, we woke up docked at a new island. Amazing. Cruises are so much fun. Of course, this was all before COVID, when it was still safe to board a cruise ship!

Cruise ships are pretty incredible to me. They are massive, can lodge thousands of people, and are full of entertainment of all sorts and an unending supply of wonderful food. You could say that they are intentionally luxurious. That is their purpose. They are built with luxury and comfort in mind.

Battleships, on the other hand, are quite different. They're often just as large as a cruise ship, and can hold just as many people on board, but they are not built for luxury, they are built for battle. They are built with the mission in mind. The people on board are not there for pleasure and a little R&R, they are there on assignment, often laying down their lives for the purpose of their mission.

When you think about these two types of ships, consider with me what type of "ship" our church—FBC Tucker—is more like. *Is our church a cruise ship or a battleship?*

It's necessary for the health of our church to consider this question. It's important how we view our church. The way in which we do will determine our own personal involvement in the life of our church, our relation to other members, and our attitude towards non-members. It will affect how we steward our resources—money, assets, people, and time. It will influence our various emphases and values. It will affect our interactions with the community of Tucker, GA.

If we view our church as a cruise ship, that makes us passengers who purchased our place, here to enjoy ourselves, relax, be catered to, and exist with no real purpose in our community. Essentially, it becomes all about us. We become the purpose and focus and it will become a tempting habit to be only focused on what

we want *individually*. We lose sight of others needs and the mission for which we were created by God.

Standing in great contrast, we can and should view the church as a battleship. If our church is a battleship, we have a mission, a commanding officer (and it's Jesus, not me), we each have duties and responsibilities, and yet, we are a part of a team with a common goal and purpose. If the church is more like a battleship than a cruise ship, we are not members here for our own comfort, but are here to serve and be faithful to the mission that God has established us for. Most foundational and important, we were recruited by the King. We didn't buy our place, so the only claim we have to be here is Jesus.

I can think of many analogies to describe the church—a family, a body, a kingdom -outpost, a hospital for the sick and broken, and yes, a battleship. But never is the church described like a cruise ship. There are so many places in Scripture we could go to look at such descriptions of the church—Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12, Ephesians 4, Colossians 1, 1 Timothy and Titus. But, just consider a few brief words from Jesus to Peter for now: "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven."—Matthew 16:18-19. This is not a cruise ship church family. This is a battleship commissioned by Jesus.

First Baptist Tucker must not function like a cruise ship. We are a battleship and we have been given a mission. We don't exist for the luxurious comfort of it's paying passengers. We exist for our God-given mission: to proclaim the good news, the gospel of Jesus, to the nations. Our mission is much like the mission Jesus proclaimed of himself: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."—Luke 4:18-19

I'm not here to tell everyone that we are a cruise ship. I'm here, as a fellow member and your pastor who loves you, to simply draw attention to what could be a tempting attitude and mindset here at FBC Tucker if we are not careful and intentional. I am attempting to highlight the real danger in allowing our church to drift towards an unhealthy, *purposeless* identity.

First Baptist Tucker family, let us not be content with cruising, but let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, our Savior, advocate, and older brother, our King and Commander. "No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him."—2 Timothy 2:4


